Program Year 2022 Summary

(July 1, 2022 - June 30, 2023)



The Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program was created by Congress in 1974 to develop viable urban communities by providing decent housing, suitable living environment, and expanding economic opportunities for primarily low and moderate-income peoples. The Town receives funding directly from the Department of Housing and Urban Development that is allocated annually for affordable housing and community development projects, as well as for urgent needs such as those caused by the ongoing economic impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic.

Over the last 20 years, the Town has deployed over \$10 Million to support community development initiatives in Chapel Hill.
